DESPITE appalling weather, 2,000 angry people marched through Bradford last Saturday to support the Bradford 12—a group of young Asians charged with conspiracy.
The 12 were arrested in July after police found a crate of empty milk bottles filled with petrol on waste ground in the city. They pinned the blame on Asian political activists.

Speaking at the rally

after the march, Avtar Jouhl from Birmingham Campaign Against Racism and Fascism said the campaign needed to be taken into the trade union movement, which was like a donkey—it wouldn't move unless it was pushed!

Anwar Ditta paid tribute to the way the Bradford 12 helped during her campaign to bring her child to this country. While Azim for the national mobilis-

ing committee said the defendants themselves should be speaking but they were gagged by the bail conditions.
