

JASWINDER KAUR IS HERE TO STAY !!

Jaswinder Kaur is another in the long line of Asian women to fall foul of the British immigration laws.

She is threatened with deportation because she married a violent man who has himself been deported. Her only chance of staying in this country is for the Home Secretary to exercise his 'compassion'. Only a massive campaign will make him do so.

JASWINDER'S CASE.

Jaswinder came to Britain in October 1975. In May 1976 she married G.S. who said he'd been here for 8 years. Jaswinder applied for permission to stay here permanently, because of her marriage to G.S. The Home Office investigated and found that G.S. was not here legally, that he was already married to someone else, and that another former (bigamous) wife had killed herself. He had been told in May 1972 that he was going to be deported.

The marriage was never happy. G.S. was violent to her and threatened her with the same fate as the wife who had committed suicide. In October 1979 she left him. Two days later the police brought their one year old son to her: G.S. had been arrested for assaulting the child. He had refused to let her take the child when she left him. G.S. was convicted and deported.

WHY SHE MUST BE ALLOWED TO STAY.

- * Jaswinder's misfortune is simply the result of the lies and violence of her husband

- * G.S. has threatened further violence if she arrives in India.
- * She has suffered enough already at the hands of this man: deportation would be further punishment.
- * Her son Manjit is a British citizen. He cannot be deported. The Home Office could split the family if it deports Jaswinder.
- * Jaswinder has a job here, her family is here and her roots are here.

Jaswinder's case is yet another proof of the injustice and racial discrimination built into the British immigration laws and rules. These laws must go.

WHAT YOU CAN DO.

- * Raise her case in your women's group, community group or trade union. Get a motion of support, collect money for the campaign. (Further details can be obtained from the address below)
 - * Write to the Under Secretary of State, Home Office, Immigration, and Nationality Division, Lunar House, Wellesley Road, Croydon CR9 2BY urging compassion.
 - * Write a similar letter to Jaswinder's M.P., Sir Keith Joseph, House of Commons, London, urging him to act on her behalf.
 - * Affiliate to the Friends of Jaswinder Kaur.
 - * Come to our meeting, where speakers will outline the immigration laws in general and Jaswinder's case in particular - and afterwards there will be a fund-raising disco.
