

Bomb charges: two more bailed

TWO MORE men accused in the so-called Bradford petrol bombs' case have been granted bail by a High Court judge in chambers, the city's magistrates were told today.

They were Giovanni Singh, 19 of Shipley Fields Road, Shipley and Vasant Patel, 20, of Ashgrove, Great Horton Road, Bradford.

Singh was granted bail with conditions that he provided two sureties, totalling £20,000; that he lived at his address in Shipley Fields Road; that he reported daily to the police; that he remained indoors between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. daily; and that he surrendered his passport.

Patel was granted bail on similar conditions, except that he provided two sureties of £500 each and that he live

at his address in Ashgrove. He was also given an additional condition that he does not take part in any public meetings or demonstrations.

Each was remanded on bail until next Wednesday. It is hoped that committal proceedings will take place the following day.

Tariq Mahmood Ali, 24, of Marlborough Road, Manningham; Tarloshan Gataura, 25, of Middle Lane, Clayton; Masud Malik, 18, of Easby Road, Little Horton; Ahmed Ibrahim Mansoor, 17, of Waverley Road, Great Horton and Pravin Patel, 20,

of Horton Grange Road, all Bradford, were remanded in custody until October 21.

Remanded

Two other men have previously been remanded in custody and a further three have been granted bail. All are from Bradford.

Two are charged with conspiring to cause damage or grievous bodily harm and making explosives with intent to endanger life. The charges follow the discovery of 38 petrol bombs on spare land in Bradford in July.

Miss Ruth Bundy, for Ali, Gataura and Vasant Patel, said the accused were being remanded until Wednesday, so the defence solicitors could have a conference with them before committal proceedings.

Reporting restrictions were lifted on a previous occasion.
