NATIONAL ASIAN YOUTH MOVEMENT

CONSTITUTION AND SUMMARISED PROGRAMME

Introduction

In the 1980's Britain is overtly becoming a racist state. Institutionalised state racism in housing, employment, and the social services has escalated with the deteriation in the economy. Surveillance and harrassment by the police, systematic persecution of black youth and the degrading separation of families under the racist immigration laws have become part and parcel of the British social system. To this must be added the arson, physical attacks and murder by fascist thugs.

The National Asian Youth Movement is a political movement of the Asian section of Black youth. The movement's programme at this stage is to fight against all forms of racism, and fight for complete equality regardless of colour, sex or religion.

The NAYM will endeavour to integrate the lessons learnt from the glorious history of struggle of the peoples of India, Pakistan, Bangladesh SriLanka and other oppressed peoples with the concrete practice of the struggles of Black youth in Britain, initiative and self-reliance, opposing both right and left opportunism.

The NAYM sees the struggle against racism in this country as part of the struggle of the oppressed people of the world against Colonialism, Zionism and racism and vows to uphold internationalism and together with fraternal organisations and parties and other oppressed peoples throughout the world to fight to the end to crush exploitation and attain freedom for mankind.

CHAPTER I NAME

Article one

The name of the organisation is National Asian Youth Movement (hereinafter referred to as NAYM)

CHAPTER 2 MEMBERSHIP

Article two

Those to be accepted as members of the NAYM are: <u>I. Asians</u> from, or originating from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka; 2. Under 35 years of age;

- Who are in agreement with the NAYM constitution;
 - 4. Who are willing to join and work actively in any of the NAYM's organisations, to carry out its resolutions, uphold discipline and to pay dues.

Article three

Applicants must fulfil requirements for acceptance individually, in accordance with the following provision: The applicant can only be accepted as full-members upon a nomination by two full members, after examination and approval by the branch meeting, following completion of a three months period as a candidate member. All branch members are cultimatedly N.A.T.M.

Article four

In certain special situations, the Executive lat all levels can accept new members directly. Jetting under the Nayon taking into econsideration

Article five

Applications from persons leaving other political organisations or members of other political organisations can only be approved by 2/3 majority of a branch meeting and forwarded to National Executive for final approval. Applications from persons leaving other political organisations after 3 years or more than 3 years continuous membership or members of other political organisations of 3 or more than 3 years duration must be forwarded to the National Executive for approval after being accepted by a branch.
