BRITAIN'S IMMIGRATION LAWS ARE RACIST. They divide families. They destroy communities. They discriminate against women.

THIS LOBBY WILL DEMAND THE REPEAL OF THESE LAWS

Britain's ban on the entry of husbands and fiances of women whose home is here has been condemned by the European Commission of Human Rights. Now the Human Rights court is likely to rule that this ban is illegal. Yet the Government is inventing new barriers to divide partners, and foreign husbands are being deported.

THIS LOBBY WILL DEMAND THAT WOMEN SHOULD NO LONGER BE FORCED TO CHOOSE BETWEEN THEIR HUSBANDS AND THEIR HOME

Families are being destroyed. Women and children are having to wait up to two years in countries like Bangladesh to be even interviewed about joining their husbands here. Then half of the applicants are refused entry on the ground that they are not "related as claimed". Yet every independent report has shown that nearly all applicants are genuine.

THIS LOBBY WILL DEMAND THAT FAMILIES BE UNITED


Last year over 40 people were deported each week. The recent report of the Commission for Racial Equality showed that the great majority were black.

- * On this card write your home address, the name of your MP and the purpose of your visit. Then your MP is fetched.
