## STOP THE CRIMINALISATION AND DEPORTATION OF BLACK YOUTH!

- Karamjit Singh and four other youths were imprisoned for arson during the uprisings of 1981. They had petrol bombed clubs that operated colour bars. At no time did the courts consider the possibility of applying sanctions with regard to the immigration status of the youths involved. Racist immigration officers initiated their own actions and became police, judge and jury in Karamjit's case. On the one hand the racist police increase the criminalisation of black youth in particular. On the other, racist immigration laws aim to deport black people for not being "conducive to the public good". The implications for black people are clear, full scale deportations will continue and increasingly involve more and more black people, until the racist governments of Britain meet the standards set by the National Front.
