STOP THE DEPORTATIONS

Bradford

In Bradford Jarnail Singh, his 2 sons, and their families, although being resident in this country for ten years, are under threat of deportation. They are accused of deception of the immigration authorities dispite an amnesty being granted for all such offences committed before 31 December 1973. The two sons - Bahadur and Mohinder Singh - were only 13 and 16 on entry to this country, yet they are accused of deceiving the authorities. None of the individuals have been informed of the case being prepared against them by the Home Office, nor have they been told of any rights they may have. They must be supported in their fight against these laws which allow for people to be uprooted from their communities and deprived of everything they have worked for.

Sheffield

In Sheffield a three year old Malayasian boy Lim Kok Keong has been denied a 6 month stay with relatives in the U.K. while his mother receives treatment for cancer in Australia and his father has to work in Singapore to pay the hospital charges. This dispite assurances that he would leave the country after the 6 months.

The Sheffield Campaign Against Immigration Laws (S.C.A.I.L.) was formed to build support for these and other Campaigns, and to fight against the threat these racist laws pose for the black people in this country. Campaigns have been won. The cases of Anwar Ditta and Jaswinder Kaur and the recent aquital of the Bradford 12 are examples of fights against the racism of the state, but there are still many more cases which need your support.
