

On 13 April 1919 General Michael O'Dwyer ordered the massacre in Jallianwala Bagh, Amritsar, of unarmed workers and peasants protesting against British rule in India. The ground was saturated with the blood of two thousand Hindu, Sikh and Muslim people. Twenty years later, the patriot Udham Singh answered the call of the Indian people and shot dead O'Dwyer at Caxton Hall in London. At his trial at the Old Bailey Law Court in London Udham Singh said:

'I am not scared of death - I am dying for my country. I have seen my people starving in India under British rule. I have protested against this. It was my duty. What greater honour could be bestowed upon me than death for the sake of my motherland?'

On 25 June 1940 Udham Singh was hanged.

Udham Singh took the name Ram Mohammed Singh Azad to show the unity of the Hindu, Muslim and Sikh people of India.



In the 1980's Asian people continue to suffer under British racist rule. Fascist activity by groups like the National Front has increased, leaving our people murdered, our shops and places of worship burnt down, and whole communities terrorised. Asian youth have been in the forefront, defending our communities, with the Bradford 12, Newham 8 and Newham 7 providing heroic examples.

True to their history, the British state has tried to crush the resistance of our people by imprisoning the youth. But time after time the community has rallied to their defence and to uphold a basic right - SELF-DEFENCE IS NO OFFENCE!

Throughout our existence in this country the British state has denied us our basic human rights. In particular, racist immigration laws have divided many thousand, of familities. Increasingly they are being used to deport thousands of people every year. But in the 1980's individuals and communities are fighting back against these racist laws. Our response is clear - HERE TO STAY! HERE TO FIGHT!
