STOP THE DEPORTATION:TASNEEM BUTT AND HER FOUR MONTHS BABY ARE HERETO STAY:_____FACTS OF THE CASE:

Tasneem came to UK as a fiancée of Mr Aftab Ahmed, a British citizen on 23rd July, 84 and was granted three months leave to enter. She got married to Mr Ahmed in September, 84. Due to lack of information she failed to make an application to the Home Office for indefinite leave to stay, on this basis, had she done so, the application would have been automatically approved.

In April, 85 she went to Pakistan for ONLY SIX days to see her mother who was seriously ill. She wasn't told by the Immigration on departure that she was technically an 'overstayer.' She lost her passport during her stay and obtained a duplicate for her journey back to UK. In addition her marriage has run in difficulties.

EXPECTANT MOTHER DETAINED:

Tasneem was eight months pregnant when she was detained by the Immigration Officer on her return to this country and was only allowed in on TEMPORARY BASIS after an intervention by Mr Geoff Lawler, a local MP.

DEPORTATION WAS ARRANGED:

TASNEEM'S DEPORTATION WAS ALL ARRANGED for 22nd September, 85 When Leeds Law centre and MP's representations were turned down by the Minister, but, at the request of the Leeds Law centre, Mr Max Madden MP was able to gain a further stop on

any deportation order pending further representations.

NO RIGHT OF APPEAL:

IT'S VERY IMPORTANT that we do everything possible before Minister TURNS DOWN representation yet again because Tasneem has no right of appeal.

FIGHT BACK IS ON:

The fight back against Tasneem's deportation is on, at a meeting held in the Manningham area of Bradford on 27th September, 85, Tasneem Butt Defence Campaign was launched by number of Black/White organisations including three women groups.

TASNEEM SAYS:-

" I can't go back to Pakistan because my marriage is running in trouble and my child who is a British citizen, would be deprived of her future. My removal from UK would cause disastrous effects because I have no one except my old parents who won't be able to cope with my problems and my return would not only add to existing feud between the families but I shall become the immediate victim of violence from my husband who is now in Pakistan and he will take away my child from me. My return to Pakistan in these circumstances is not only unsafe for me but the breakdown of marriage would be seen as a disgrace by members of my family and neighbours"

COME AND JOIN US:-

Brothers/Sisters come and join us. Let us tell the Home Office that Tasneem has a right to stay...
