AS you will be aware the fight for jobs at Laurence Scott's has reached a crucial stage. In the seventh month of their dispute company Arthur Snipe organised an SAS commando-style raid into the factory with two helicopters in a bid to break the 24 hour picket.

In response the Laurence Scott's Strike Committee decided that theonly way to win their jobs battle was to resume the flying picket of Scott's HQ Mining Supplies in Doncaster. After a promise of support from the Right to Work Campaign the go-ahead was given.

For the last two weeks Scotts strikers and unemployed workers from across the country have managed to turn away numerous transport vehicles from the Doncaster plant. At the same time injunctions have been slapped on the pickets making this a test case of the Tories Employment Act.

The Laurence Scott Strike Committee and the Right to Work campaign are now urgently appealing for funds to assist their struggle. 24 hour picketing of all seven gates can only be maintained if the Right to Work Campaign can mobilise sufficient numbers of unemployed to help maintain it. We desperately need cash to help the transport costs to get the unemployed from your area to Doncaster.
