STOP RACIAL AND POLICE HARASSMENT.

1982 saw an increasing number of attacks on the black community in Sheffield. In response, hundreds of people marched through the streets of Sheffield in August, protesting at the increase in racial violence and the insensitive police reaction. However, the only police reaction was to organise heavier policing in the areas of Broomhall and Burngreave, similar to the police action which led to the riots last year in Southall and Brixton.

Whenever black people go to hospital or the D.H.S.S. their status is checked. Many are denied rights to free health care and Social Security. Deportations are becoming more frequent. We must not allow this to happen and call on all progressive people to join us a day of solidarity in protest at the increasing harassment of black people in Sheffield. We demand our democratic rights and the right to defend ourselves.

STOP RANJIT'S DEPORTATION.

Ranjit Chakravorty, a member of our community is faced with the threat of deportation. Ranjit, who first came to Britain in 1977, has on a voluntary basis contributed to the Bangladeshi community and to the Sheffield community as a whole,

- as an interpreter of Sylheti in the courts, at Tribunals and hospitals, the D.H.S.S. and in his work with solicitors,
- as an advisor over housing, health, and employment issues.
- as a teacher of English to Bengali people.

Yet the Home Office claims that Ranjit lacks support from his community. Prove the racist Home Office wrong. Show your support for Ranjit on the demonstration.
