

"STOP AURANGZEB'S REMOVAL FROM THE U.K.!"

Dear Colleagues,

We are writing to you to draw your attention to the plight of Aurangzeb a resident of Bradford who has lived in Britain for 11 years, and is currently under threat of removal from this country.

Aurangzeb came here in 1972, at the age of 13, having been sent here on a false passport by his parents, to live with relatives. He continued to use the name imposed on him by his family, and went to Pakistan for a holiday in 1976. He returned home to Bradford believing his status in this country was unchanged. His family intended him to enter into an arranged marriage. However, at the age of 20, he chose his own bride, against the will of his elders, and subsequently, for revenge they reported him to the Home Office as an illegal immigrant.

We believe that the Home Secretary should in this case use his discretion to allow Aurangzeb to stay in Bradford with his family. He has two British born British Citizen children. His wife has recently been given permission to stay here by the Home Office. Aurangzeb can not take his wife with him to Pakistan, as she would be rejected by his family there and become destitute. Aurangzeb has worked here and has been a law-abiding citizen. To remove him would be to ruin his life and that of his wife and children for no good reason.

Experience has shown that the Home Office ARE prepared, seriously to consider compassionate circumstances - sometimes. But this requires wide public support. We are calling upon you to help Aurangzeb. As a first step we invite you to a meeting to be held at:-
