## BLOOD TEST RESULTS - POSITIVE Home office response - negative

The probability that the 38 DNA fingerprint bands of Salema Begum can all be matched by chance with bands in Mr. Gura Miah's and Mrs. Azizun Nessa's DNA fingerprints is more than 390 thousand million to one against.

On the 9th of January the results of the blood tests were finally received.Salema's family had to pay £500 to be told something they already knew- that Salema <u>IS</u> her parents daughter.

Salema came out of sanctuary when her safety was guaranteed.

Manchester Chief Immigration Officer Nicolson promised to recommend to Renton (the minister responsible for deportations) that Salema could stay permanently when the blood test results proved positive.

He said he could see"no problems." Renton also promised to reconsider Salema's case "sympathetically." Now the Home Office are saying they have to finish their investigations in Bangladesh before they can make any decisions They refuse to make any comments about the blood test results.

WHAT MORE DO THEY NEED TO KNOW? We are demanding the Home Office recognise Salema's right to live with her parents NOW and stop looking for ways to get out of their promises. Salema has been living under the threat of Temporary Admission Orders.This one runs out on the 1st March 1988.A Temporary Admission Order can be revoked at any time and only increases the family's insecurity.

The Home Office is using delaying tactics.Support is essential,now more than ever,so as not to allow the Home Office to issue a third Temporary Admission Order.
