

The determination and hard work of all those involved in the campaign was rewarded by the arrival of a letter from the Home Office on 5th March 1985, stating that the Home Secretary had reveiwed his previous decision on "compassionate grounds" and that the Aslams could stay in this country for an "indefinite" period.

The family and other members of the campaign wish to extend their sincerest gratitude to all of you who have participated and supported them in their fight against this country's racist immigration laws. Without your active support we could not have turned what was deemed a "hopeless" case into a victory for all black people. This victory will be an inspiration to all those fighting the same battle and we hope that your support will continue and win many more deportation cases.
