

### BABA BAKHTAURA MUST STAY!

#### Baba Bakhtaura

Baba Bakhtaura is a Punjabi folk musician who has lived in Birmingham since coming to this country in 1979. He is happily married to Permjit, a British citizen, and the couple have 2 children, Samita 4 and Charan 2.

Since 1982 the Home Office has been trying to deport Baba despite a great deal of support for him among the Asian community.

Baba's case has been heard in one court after another over the past 5 years. Baba lost his initial appeals to the Immigration Appeals Adjudicator and Tribunal (both appointed by the Home Office). Then in 1984 he won in the High Court, only to find the Home Office going to the Court of Appeal to try and defeat him. Finally Baba won in the House of Lords, who ruled that the Immigration Appeals Tribunal should take account of Baba's valuable service to the Asian community as a folk singer and charity performer.

But in March 1987, the Home Office-appointed Tribunal yet again turned down his appeal.

Baba and Permjit now face a final interview with the Home Office to see whether Baba can be allowed to stay. It is the last chance for this family to be kept together.

#### **The Immigration Laws**

The immigration laws have a long history:

In 1962 there was the Common-wealth Immigrants Act. Then in 1968 came another Common-wealth Immigrants Act. Then came the 1971 Immigration Act. After that the 1981 Nationality Act, and most recently, in 1986 came visa controls for black visitors. What all these laws have in common is their attack upon the rights of black people.

It is not only Tory governments which have passed these racist laws. The Labour Party also shares responsibility for this. Racist immigration laws divide many thousands of black families. Well over a thousand black people are deported from the UK every year. In many cases it is impossible for a black person to marry someone of their own choice.
